Lamont Germany


Sports Anchor, XM-Satellite Radio, Co-Founder Heritage Sports Roadio Network

Lamont Germany is a 30 year veteran of the broadcast industry, who has enjoyed a varied and comprehensive multi-media career on the local, regional and national level. His career path has afforded an opportunity to experience the full broadcast gamut.

The Morgan State University graduate ('80), was born in Pittsburgh, PA and was bitten by the radio bug practically at birth. His father, Albert Germany (Al Gee) was a popular Dee-Jay in Pittsburgh, and later in Washington, D.C. and New York.

Germany grew up wanting to follow in his father footsteps, and got his first broadcast opportunity while a student at Morgan State University. Under the guidance of News Director Larry Dean and Program Director Kweisi Mfume, Germany interned in the newsroom at Morgan State University owned and operated WEAA-FM.

As a student reporter, he covered the gamut; politics, crime, arts, entertainment, and sports. His experience at WEAA served as the foundation for his career after graduation.



Germany's experience at WEAA led to other broadcast opportunities, including a stint at several of the highest rated stations in the Baltimore-Washington metropolitan area WPOC (FM 93) in Baltimore, MD. And WBAL-AM in Baltimore. At WBAL, Germany enjoyed a 12 year career as a news anchor and General Assignment reporter. During his WBAL tenure, he covered Baltimore City, Baltimore County and Maryland politics.

The emergence of new technologies in the industry eventually led to a strong interest in satellite radio. Germany was hired as a Sports Anchor at Sirius-XM Satellite radio in Washington, D.C. in April of 2005. At Sirius-XM, Germany was heard on a national platform. His work could be found on the various sports channels on the platform. Germany has also free lanced in Baltimore area high school sports.

He's had the opportunity to sit behind the microphone at high school football and basketball games since 1995. And in addition to his experience on the high school level, he's also had the privilege of serving as the primary Play by Play voice of Morgan State University athletics. Germany has been the "Voice of Morgan" since for more than three decades.

In 2007, Germany and several partners realized a career dream with the formation of the Heritage Sports Radio Network (HSRN). The network is dedicated to the national broadcast of HBCU athletics. It affords Historic Black Colleges and Universities a platform for exposure that previously did not exist. HSRN programming can be heard on Sirius-XM radio and 30 radio stations across the country.

Germany currently resides in Parkville, Maryland.



Keynote Speaker

Charles "Choo" Smith

President / CEO, Choo Smith Youth Enterprise, LLC



Charles "Choo" Smith is the only child born to Brenda and Charles H. Smith., Sr. He was born on November 30, 1970 and was raised in West Baltimore. He graduated from the historic City College High School in 1988. While he excelled at baseball, he soon realized his true love was for the game of basketball. Charles was the starting point guard for the varsity team and quickly rose to the rank of captain.

Charles attended Bowie State University in Maryland. He soon became the institution's starting point guard. After his first year of college Charles was recruited by Mr. Will Jones, head coach of the University of the District of Columbia.

Choo immediately earned his spot as the starting point guard. Led by Choo, the Firebirds went seven games over .500 for the first time in 10 years. Choo was honored for his exceptional basketball skills and finished his college career as the school's all time leader in Steals and Assists. During this time Choo was voted MVP of the team, he won The Pigskin Classic Award as the "Best Player" in the region and the Reslyn W. Henry Memorial Award. Charles "Choo" Smith graduated from the University of the District of Columbia with a Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science.

Charles caught the eye of a representative from the world-renowned Original Harlem Globetrotters and signed a contract to join the team. He moved to the top of the pyramid by becoming a high-profile member of the team until 2001 when he sustained what some thought would be a career ending back injury. He soon recovered and began playing for the Harlem Wizards from 2001-2002 and then overseas in the Euro League with the Vienna Basket Hounds from 2002-2003. Charles has played in all 50 States and in 26 countries. He was recognized as one of the greatest dribblers in the world.

Charles founded Choo Smith Youth Empowerment, a non-profit organization that focuses on his "4L" philosophy (Love it, Learn it, Live it, Lead it) and Choo Smith Enterprise a for-profit corporation. From these organizations the Choo Smith Summer Basketball Camp was born. This camp became the platform for many initiatives under Choo Smith Youth Empowerment, Inc.

Choo has the ability to reach children and youth right where they are in life. His drive and determination will not allow him to ever leave any child where he found them. His motives and heart are pure from the sense that he wants nothing from the children and families he helps but to position them to be successful. The integrity that he exhibits magnifies itself in everything that he's involved with. Choo does not compromise his ethics and faith in Christ for any reason. He has a heart of gold. No matter what time of the day, if a child needs to talk to him about anything, he always makes himself available. He is soft spoken, but when he speaks he commands the attention of the audience he is speaking to. Failure is never an option. He pushes the athletes he trains to reach their full potential. He gives of his time, money and whatever is needed of him freely.

Choo has been featured on local and national television networks like Fox News, NBC, ABC and Cornerstone Television. Choo has appeared on television shows like Good Fellas of Baltimore, a Fox reality show, and the new ABC Reality show Ball Boys. As a humanitarian, Charles "Choo" Smith has and continues to touch the lives of youth throughout Maryland and across the world.

Today, Charles resides in Maryland and is married to his wife of 9 years, Damali Smith and together they have three children, Ayanna, Charles and Layla.

MD/AAU OUSTANDING ATHLETE AWARD

The MD/AAU Outstanding Athlete Award is presented to the athlete who excelled in performance in their respective sport, used their talents to best of their abilities and was motivated to excellence in athletic endeavors.

MD/AAU COACH AWARD

The MD/AAU Coach Award is presented to coaches that through their major commitment of time, patience, and instruction make it possible for the many MD/AAU athletes to train and successfully compete. And through their understanding ways and their knowledge of the game embrace inspiration, motivation, and dedication as the building blocks that athletes need for success in sports and life. Each Sports Director recommends their choice (from their sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

MD/AAU "VOLUNTEER SPIRIT" AWARDS

The MD/AAU "Volunteer Spirit" Awards are presented to individuals who embrace the true meaning of "giving their time and energy to benefit others," and do so in the "spirit" of what all of AAU really stands for: a commitment and dedication to America's children to grow as individuals and become tomorrow's leaders. These volunteers, who give of themselves, can always be counted on to be there, and always bring the team spirit with them. Each Sports Director makes these recommendations (from the sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

JOHN G. CONSIDINE - "SPORTS DIRECTOR MEMBERSHIP AWARD"

This award honors the late John Considine and is awarded to the Maryland AAU Sports Director that shows the largest percentage increase in new registrations (athletes and clubs) over the year and the most registered participants. This award promotes both his legacy and passion for involving more and more athletes and volunteers in the fun and spirit of the AAU. The Governor and Registrar finalize selection.

WILLIAM "BILL" STEVENS - "CLUB EXECUTIVE OF THE YEAR AWARD"

This award pays tribute to the sports/club Volunteer, who takes pride in the finer details of AAU paperwork and documentation in ensuring that their club is administratively signed, sealed and delivered for competition (local, state or national). Each Sports Director makes these recommendations (from their sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

RALPH L. DURANT MEMORIAL AWARD

This award was established to give tribute to the outstanding architecting that Ralph Durant did with the Track and Field program of Baltimore City and the mentoring of youth and young adults in the program. Ralph Durant's name is synonymous with youth track and field excellence. Athletes are selected for their successes during the year's competitions in addition to their prowess at the National Junior Olympics and submitted to the Banquet Chairperson.


GOVERNOR'S AWARD

This award pays tribute to Melvin Parker, who served as the President of the Maryland District for 10 years and Boys Basketball Chairman for 10 years. The Award is given annually to the top male and female athletes who achieve a high standard of performance in AAU sanctioned district, regional, or national competition. The award will be presented to two individuals under the age of 18, in recognition of their commitment and achievement in their chosen sport. Each Sports Director submits an application for the recommendation.

Jump Rope Lauren Bork

Lauren has been a member of the Kangaroo Kids Jump Rope Team for over 10 years and has competed in both AAU and USA Jump Rope events, including qualifying to compete at both the AAU Junior Olympic Games and USAJR National Championships for 9 consecutive years! Lauren is a very active and dedicated team member, and is an ambassador for the sport of jump rope! She has performed in various shows across the region, taught at workshops and camps, and has competed in both regional and national tournaments. Her accomplishments during the 2013 AAU season include placing 1st in individual freestyle, placing 3rd overall in individual events for her age group, 3rd overall in Double Dutch events, and 1st in Senior Group Routine; as well as placing 1st in 11 out of 12 events at the Maryland AAU Qualifier.

Lauren has served as a Team Captain, and as a Group Leader at many workshops and camps. She has been responsible for the choreography of many routines used by the Kangaroo Kids Performing, Travel, and Competition Teams; including the gold medal winning Senior Team Show routine at this year's AAU Junior Olympic Games. She also volunteered at many AAU tournaments, helping as a runner or tabulator, and assisting with set-up and clean-up. Lauren has stepped up as a leader on her team and in her sport, and is someone younger athletes look up to.

Lauren's dedication and leadership is prevalent in all aspects for her life. As a student at Reservoir High School, she played soccer all four years, served as Vice-President of Best Buddies, is the Editor-in-Chief of the school newspaper, the student leader of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and is a member of both the National Honor Society and Spanish Honor Society. She is also an actively involved member of her church's youth ministry, participating in weekly bible studies and serving on the leadership team.

Lauren was able to manage her busy schedule without it taking a toll on her academic performance. She graduated with a final un-weighted GPA of a 4.0 and weighted GPA of a 4.67. Her grades put her in the top 5% of her class, with her rank being #1 un-weighted and #8 weighted. She was a National Merit Commended Scholar and an AP Scholar.

Track and Field D'Amaie Davis

D'Amaie Davis is both an athlete and a scholar. She strives to do her best on and off the track. She began competing in AAU Track & field in 2009. She has been on the podium every year since, as a Race walker. D'Amaie is a three-times National Champion and All-American in her event, at both 1500 meters and 3000 meters distances. In addition to Race Walking, she competes in Hurdles and High Jump.

Being able to compete and win her third National Race Walk Title this year was especially fulfilling. She suffered a strained MCL and a sprained kneecap in May, which almost ended her season. After the injury, she stayed focused and faithful to her physical therapy. D'Amaie worked through a tough period of rehabilitation and doubt filled days. Her focus was simple, "Just finish what you start!"

D'Amaie has that same focus in the class room. She is a two-time Carson Scholarship recipient, and consistent Honor Roll student. As a 9th Grader this year, she is taking almost all honors courses at Baltimore Poly High School.




This fairytale year has provided an abundance of unforgettable memories and instilled these young athletes with qualities that will allow them to excel both on and off the court.

MD Track and Field Highlights



Athletes competed in AAU Area 3 National Qualifier in 9 different age divisions, based on year of birth, for both girls and boys. The National Qualifier was held in Hagerstown, MD., where the top 4 individuals or relays in each division advanced to the National Championship. The AAU Junior Olympics Games Track & Field National Championship was held on July 27 to August 3 at Olds-Marshall Track, Rynearson Stadium, Eastern Michigan University, in Ypsilanti, MI.

The National Meet had over 13,000 athletes entered, where the top 8 individuals or relay received medals.

Maryland had over 70 athletes to make it to the podium and win medals.



Central Maryland Swimming League: A Great Season!

The Central Maryland Swimming League (CMSL) provides competitive summer swimming programs for children of member pools to help advance aquatic skills, promote teamwork and principles of good sportsmanship, and develop a love of the sport. The league is comprised of 50 teams separated into nine divisions across four counties and Baltimore City. Division membership is determined each year based on the performance of a team during the previous year and may change from year to year. Each athlete, coach and team representative is an AAU member. With over 5,000 members, CMSL is the largest swimming organization within AAU.



The league provides swimmers with several levels of competition to assist in their development as athletes and well-rounded individuals. The official season consists of five dual meets, a league-wide invitational meet called Straehles for which swimmers must have achieved minimum qualifying times, and

divisional championship meets at the end of the season. All dual meets are held at member pools on Saturday mornings in June and July. Many teams also organize additional interdivisional and novice meets throughout the season to provide more opportunities for competition and fun. Some examples include time trials, county-based invitational meets, rock-and-roll relays and dive-in movies.
