MD OUTSTANDING ATHLETE AWARD

The MD/AAU Outstanding Athlete Award is awarded to the athlete who excelled in performance in their respective sport, used talent to best of his/her ability and was motivated to excellence in athletic endeavors.

MD/AAU COACH AWARD

The MD/AAU Coach Award is presented to coaches that through their major commitment of time, patience, and instruction make it possible for the many MD/AAU athletes to train and successfully compete. And through their understanding ways and their knowledge of the game embrace inspiration, motivation, and dedication as the building blocks that athletes need for success in sports and life. Each Sport Director recommends their choice (from their sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

MD/AAU "VOLUNTEER SPIRIT" AWARDS

The MD/AAU "Volunteer Spirit" Awards is presented to individuals who embrace the true meaning of "giving their time and energy to the benefit of others," and do so in the "spirit" of what all of AAU really stands for: a commitment and dedication to America's children to grow as individuals and become tomorrow's leaders. These volunteers, who give of themselves, can always be counted on to be there, and always bring the team spirit with them. Each Sport Director makes these recommendations (from the sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

JOHN G. CONSIDINE – "SPORT DIRECTOR MEMBERSHIP AWARD"

This award honors the late John Considine and is awarded to the Maryland AAU Sport Director that shows the largest percentage increase in new registrations (athletes and clubs) over the year and the most registered participants. This promotes both his legacy and passion for involving more and more athletes and volunteers in the fun and spirit of the AAU. The Governor and Registrar finalize selection.

WILLIAM "BILL" STEVENS – "CLUB EXECUTIVE OF THE YEAR AWARD"

This award pays tribute to the sports/club Volunteer, who takes pride in the finer details of AAU paperwork and documentation in ensuring that their club is administratively signed, sealed and delivered for competition (local, state or national). Each Sport Director makes these recommendations (from their sport) to the Banquet Chairperson.

RALPH L. DURANT MEMORIAL AWARD

This award was established to give tribute to the outstanding architecting that Ralph Durant did with the Track and Field program of Baltimore City and the mentoring of youth and young adults in the program. Ralph Durant's name is synonymous with youth track and field excellence. Athletes are selected for their successes during the year's competitions in addition to their prowess at the National Junior Olympics and submitted to the Banquet Chairperson.

GOVERNOR'S AWARD

This award pays tribute to individuals who have demonstrated extraordinary leadership along with demonstrating professionalism and promoting the AAU. Each Sport Director makes recommendation (from their sport) to the Governor.

MEL PARKER AWARD

This award pays tribute Melvin Parker served as the President of the Maryland District for 10 years and Boys Basketball Chairman for 10 years. Award is given annually to the top male and female athlete who achieves a high standard of performance in AAU sanctioned district, regional, or national competition. The award will be presented to two individuals under the age of 18, in recognition of their commitment and achievement in their chosen sport. Each Sport Director submits an application for the recommendation.

Master of Ceremonies

Rick Perry *Morgan State University*

Acres Recardo Perry, fondly referred to as “Rick” was employed for 39 years at Morgan State University. Rick retired on July 1, 2011. His career tenure in higher education and administration has been marked by boundless successes for the students and Morgan State University.

His service in numerous capacities such as Assistant Director of Learning Resources, Assistant Dean, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs, Special Assistant to the President, and his greatest accomplishment, Vice President for Student Affairs, were always achieved with excellence.

Mr. Perry not only gave his time and energy to the students and Morgan, but also his personal finances to hundreds of needy students. Even after his recent retirement, one can find him volunteering in the Office of Financial Aid. He has been recognized and achieved numerous awards for outstanding leadership not only from the Student Government Association Administrators, but also from his peers and from the Maryland State Department of Education.



Mr. Perry earned the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science, a Master of Arts Degree in History, and also the Master of Business Administration at Morgan State University. While matriculating in college, he was recognized with memberships in several honor societies, including Phi Alpha Theta International Honor Society for History, the Golden Key National Honor Society, and the Beta Gamma Sigma Honor Society for Business.

He is a member of the Saint Matthew Catholic Church where he has served on the Parish Council, as the Director for Christ Renews His Parish Ministry, as a Lector, and as a member of the Board for the Cardinal Shehan School. In addition, he has served on the Archdiocese of Baltimore School System Public Relations and Marketing Committee.

Rick is married to Dr. Evelyn Perry and is the proud father of two sons, Marc and Clay.

Keynote Speaker

Nathaniel J. McFadden *Maryland State Senator*



Senator Nathaniel J. McFadden was born in Philadelphia, PA, and at the age of four his family moved to Baltimore, where he currently resides. Mac, as he is affectionately known, attended Baltimore City public schools and graduated from the Baltimore City College High School in 1964. He attended Morgan State College where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in geography and history in 1968 and a Masters of Science degree in history and social science in 1972. He was also enrolled in Morgan's Doctoral program where he completed one year of an Urban Educational Administration Degree Program.

Senator McFadden began his professional career in 1968 as a teacher at Dunbar Senior High School. Subsequently, he served in various positions in the field of education including Coordinator, Educational Opportunity Program, Lake Clifton/Eastern Senior High School; Department Head of Social Studies, Lombard Junior High School and later at Southwestern Senior High School; Principal of Dunbar Adult Evening School. Currently, he is a facilitator with the Baltimore City Public Schools.

Long and active in local politics, Senator McFadden served on the Baltimore City Council from 1982 to 1987. He has also served twelve years on the Democratic State Central Committee and four years as Secretary of the Maryland Democratic Party. McFadden serves as the Senate Representative on the Advisory Committee of the Naming of State Facilities, Roads and Bridges, task force to study raising the compulsory public school attendance age to 18 and task force on Minority Participation in the Environmental Community. McFadden has been a member of the Maryland State Senate for ten years where he currently serves as the President Pro Tem in the history of the Maryland State Senate - the first Black Majority Leader was also a Mason - Senator Clarence W. Blount. Senator McFadden was recently appointed vice-chair of the Budget and Taxation Committee for the Senate of Maryland. He served as the Chairman of the Baltimore City Senate Delegation.

A member of the Southern Legislative Conference of the Council of State Government (Education Committee), National Conference of State Legislatures (Budgets and Revenue Committee) and Board of Trustees for Maryland Citizens for the Arts. A recipient of the 2009 State of Maryland First Citizen's Award and recipient of the 2009 Maryland National Guard Freestate Challenge Academy Lifetime Achievement Award and 2009 Recipient of Morgan State University's Alumni of the Year Award. A member of the Council of State Governments-Eastern Regional Conference-ERC and Canadian Provinces Committee. A member of the Blue Ribbon Commission on Maryland Transportation Funding. Recently, appointed a member of the Budget and Revenue Committee for the National Conference of State Legislators (NCSL). Member of the Budget Chair and Tax Roundtable for the Council of State Governments-Eastern Regional Conference.

Senator McFadden of Baltimore City's 45th Legislative District has been a member of Southern Baptist Church for the past thirty-two years. He is happily married to his wife Rachel and is the proud father of three adult sons.

The first year of Maryland A.A.U. Lacrosse was successful in establishing a new summer lacrosse program for youths to play. We totaled over 65 kids ages 5- 16 years old. Our home field was Forest Park H.S.

We started in May by attending the Div 1,2,&3 NCAA Championship games at M&T Stadium. We played in the Lax Splash, Pikesville Invitational, Patriot Games and The Trilogy Summer League. Our program always stressed the values maintaining a high standard of academic excellence. This shows as our overall GPA was 83.1.



We were able to send several players to several lacrosse camps. We attended The Summer Bounce Camp in New Hampshire; The Fellowship of Christian Athletes in Gettysburg, Pa, and the All Pro Camp at Goucher College, Md.

As we move into the 2012 season, we plan to work with Keion Carpenter's Shutdown Academy in expanding the level of academic excellence. We intend to raise our math, writing, and reading skills while playing high level lacrosse tournaments.

Our first game of pool play was against Louisville Elite. This game prove to be very challenging due to the fact that we jump out to a early lead of more than 10 points but had to watch as our kids went cold the last two quarters of the game. Louisville came all the way back to even the game at 21-21 with about 3:00 minutes to play. At this time we got timely scores from Trayon Wright and Anthony Carpenter to finish off a close game 27-25. What a way to start the tournament.

Our second pool game was against Next Level Sports out of Potomac Valley. This game our kids came out firing on all pistons. Jamaal Quickley and Jalen Yates had great games from beyond the three point line. We coasted to a 49-19 victory.

Our next game prove to be much of the same from game two. The kids were playing at a great level on both ends of the court winning easily 45-21. We moved into bracket play as the first place team from our pool. Now the fun really begins. We explained to the boys that it was one and done from here on out, so we couldn't have any let downs. Our first bracket game was against Kentucky Elite. During this game the kids came out pretty slow making for a tight game at halftime with us leading by 1. During halftime we order the kids to attack the basket and boy did they. Lead by Trayon Wright and Jamaal Quickley the kids got to basket making easy buckets and give up easy layups to our post player Darius Woods And Todd Gray Jr.

We pulled away in the fourth quarter winning 33-18. Game 2 was against Metro Sixers of Potomac Valley. This game saw us jump out to a early lead behind the shooting of Jalen Yates who hit 3 three point baskets in a row to open up a 12 point lead for us leading into the second quarter. Again we had to fight to hold our lead but we maintain a 10 point lead for most of the game winning 40-30. On to the semi-finals. Game three was against Visionary Basketball Club from New England. This game prove to be a great game. We went back and forth with them for most of the first half, only leading by 5 at halftime. In the second half we gain control thanks to the defensive pressure of Travis Doppins and rebounding of Odell Dickerson.



We won 44-37. Onto the championship. In the championship we would face the team who had given us our closest game in pool play the Louisville Elite. we talk to the kids before the game and told them that they had done a great job o get this far but it was time to finish the job. We remind them about how in our first meeting we let up once we got the lead and it all most cost us the game, so go out there and play the whole game hard.

The kids took to heart what we had said and went out and build a early 10 point lead and never were really pressured. every time Louisville would try to make a run they would just fight through it and come up with one great play after another.

They could not be stop during this game. Final score was 45-36. We had done it. We were the 2011 National Champions!

All of our hard work paid off as the now 9U Baltimore Stars team finished with an impressive 5 – 1 record at the Nationals AAU Tournament in Memphis, TN clinching 3rd place.

With all of our success, we are very excited about the up-coming season. Because we finished in the final four at the AAU Nationals Tournament, we are guaranteed a spot for the upcoming 9U nationals tournament which will be held in Orlando, FL in April 2012.
